## A Thought for April


#### Rector's notes for April – new life and new hope for the Church

write this on an early spring day when the sun has decided to make an appearance, and there is definitely the beginning of some warmth about it. I can't be the only one for whom this time of year is the best. On top of this being Easter season for the next six Sundays, with all the joy and hope of Jesus' resurrection life to celebrate and ponder, we have these great visual reminders of new life all around us, as life in the fields, hedgerows and our gardens begins to burst into new birth again.

New resurrection life is one of Christianity's most distinctive features, and we hope our churches embody it in some way all the year round. Jesus has risen from the dead, and so paves the way for resurrection for all whose life on this earth comes to an end.

But before that, there is this life to be lived, with all its opportunities and challenges! It's worth imagining how the disciples of Jesus navigated that first Easter season – ecstatic with joy that Jesus was alive again, but also wondering what the future would hold. Yet the miracle of the resurrection, and the power of God which came upon them at Pentecost was sufficient to keep them trusting in God for whatever would become of them in God's service, even in the face of persecution.

We don't know how the future of our churches will play out. But we do know that our God is the same God who raised Jesus from the dead, and sends his Holy Spirit to give us the power for whatever tasks he wants us to fulfil – even if at any one time we don't know quite what this will mean for us in the future.



On 7th April we say farewell and thank you to Revd Teresa Michaux, team vicar in Calne, and until Revd Sarah Errington is licensed in mid-June we will be more reliant than usual on the kind and very capable lay ministers and retired clergy whom we value so highly to lead much of our worship. We trust God to lead us into this time of change, and to give us his power to accomplish what he intends for us in the service of our communities.

## **Snippets from the Past**

he Victoria County History gives us some illuminating insights into the past incumbents of St Mary's church.

In 1389 Calne was among places in which a *William Ramsbury*, apparently in minor orders, allegedly preached heresy and conducted services which imitated mass. In 1406, vestments, a breviary and two processional candlesticks went missing from Calne church. Who took them? The Dean of Salisbury Cathedral ordered the churchwardens to provide an antiphony (a book of plainsong), a psalter and an ordinal in 1412. Had they been purloined, was there a market in stolen church materials?

In 1409 the vicar was taken to task for not accompanying funeral processions, was he not interested? In the early 15th century the church had three silver-gilt chalices and other plate. Most of the plate had been lost or stolen by 1551.

In 1540, the vicar, suspected of papistry for failing to remove the name of St Thomas a Becket from a book, was found to have erred through negligence. In 1587 a clerk, possibly a curate, was accused of purifying a strumpet without imposing penance.

A William Mortimer was vicar 1602-53. Thomas Jones, apparently his succesor, was expelled from the living at the Restoration. Too inured in the ways of puritanism? A contrast over the centuries in custom practised. In 1766, when the vicar was an invalid, a curate held two services each Sunday and services on Wednesdays, Fridays and holy days.

John Guthrie, vicar 1835-65, oversaw the restoration of the south and west parts of the church to designs by William Slater and the construction of



a chapel of ease at Quemerford during 1852-3 (now Holy Trinity Church). The churchyard replaced that of St Mary's church as the parish graveyard. However, apart from 1863-4 when Calne church

was being restored, the chapel of ease was not licensed for the solemnization of marriage until 1990. Guthrie also promoted parochial schools, a friendly society and a literary institution in Calne.

John Duncan, vicar 1865-1907, instituted a daily service and weekly communion at St Mary's Calne and in 1870 introduced a surpliced choir. In the

same year Calne was one of the few parishes in the Wiltshire part of the Salisbury Diocese in which communion was celebrated every Sunday and on holy days. *John Duncan's* high church teaching




caused some parishoners to leave the church in 1866 and to found a free church. Characters all!


