

A Thought for February

aster falls early in 2024 (on 31st March), and that means Lent begins with Ash Wednesday in the middle of this month—on 14th February. So you could choose to take your nearest and dearest out to a Valentine's meal with a big ash cross on your forehead!

The season of Lent actually has quite a lot going on in it. Traditionally it's a time of self-examination and



penitence, and the concept of giving something up for Lent relates to self-denial, of course. But also during Lent, in the story of Jesus' own life there is the dramatic turn to the cross and the intensity for us of reliving the Passion of Christ in Holy Week, and our own consideration of what discipleship might cost us. In between-this year it falls on Sunday 10th March-is Mothering Sunday; celebrating our mothers whether they have died or are still with us, and paying attention too to those among us for whom the whole issue of motherhood is difficult.

One of the characteristic features of the world we inhabit is how relentless is the pace of life and the flow of information from every direction. Most of us are almost instantly connected with the world all the time. I remember when my daughter was a teenager, on one occasion being full of anguish because her best friend hadn't replied to a message. 'When did you send it?' I asked. She looked at her phone. '17 minutes ago!'

We all surely benefit from a conscious disconnecting from the world from time to time, and if it feels like we haven't done that for a while, what better time than Lent (or whenever you might happen to be reading this)? 'What's keeping you busy?' is quite a useful question to ask ourselves; 'Which of those busy things really matters?' might be a helpful follow up, because it's possible to spend a lot of our time busy with things that in the end are not that important. I hope this



Lent might offer you a moment to reflect on which are the really important things for you, and to appreciate them in a fresh way.

South Wall of the Sanctuary. Stained glass window

his window, of stained painted glass and lead, in two panels, was assembled in 1869 by Ward & Hughes. When the light shines

through it, it provides a wonderful uplifting image bringing delight to the eye with lovely clear colours.

The stonework of this window illustrates a pair of cinquefoil headed lights under a flattened Tudor arch, with splayed reveals, hollow chamfered jambs and mullions, and a splay below over a narrow sill.

The left-hand panel depicts the figure of Mary Magdalene with flowing yellow hair,

kneeling looking up at the figure of Christ in light. Her hands are raised in supplication. She is clothed in a blue tunic over which is a worn red cloak. The background shows a garden of three trees and flowers with hills of blue and green. The inscription

below reads: TOUCH ME NOT FOR I AM NOT. At the base of this light and of the adjacent panel within 3 arches are designs of stylised triple leaved

foliage.

The right-hand panel depicts Christ. He stands looking down upon Mary Magdalene with light illuminating her face, his right hand raided in blessing. He has a nimbus (halo) around his head and is bearded with long hair. He wears a red tunic. Over his left shoulder, part of a white, blue and gold edged stole shows, which falls to cover his body from the waist down. The

back ground continues the depiction of the garden in light. The inscription below reads: NOT YET ASCENDED TO MY FATHER.
